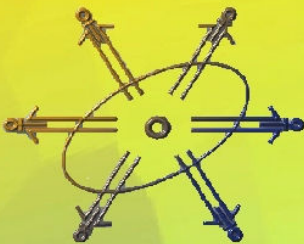

Objectives:

Double-objective of the competence-course: acquisition and practice of the special English, used in mechanics parallel with giving further mechanical engineering education to the Hungarian secondary and higher graduates. There were 10 (30 hours each) subjects organized into 4 hours language, IT, management and 6 hours mechanical modules. The courses started with an evaluative test and ensured a flexible system of different ways of learning for individual knowledge and special professional interest by offering compulsory and optional subjects. The training was realized in a form of effective and flexible distance education. Advanced electronic way of learning was realized in the e-learning framework, using authentic English mechanical materials, video films, and multimedia materials.

Target Group:

- Secondary technical and mechanical engineering graduates, technicians, working for domestic companies, with foreign and multinational owner/management,
- Top and middle managers of the management of domestic industrial companies, who have to represent their company in professional meetings, negotiations using English language in order to develop the international connections and market positions of their company,
- Entrant mechanical engineers, who would like to enter the EU labour market as competent applicants,
- University students, PhD students who would like to take part in partial education and professional practice abroad,
- The engineer and English teachers of the secondary technical school – exploring the opportunities of professional related language teaching reaching the multiplier effect.
